The President to Start for Calfornia on the 14th,

MOTHING NOW TO DETAIN HIM

The Italian Affair Not Domed of Serious Import in Adminstrative Circles.

Officials Not Worrying on Account of the Absence of a Full-Sedged Italian Minister in Washington-No Unusual Pales Will Alkely Be Taken to Appears the Wrath of Italy.

WARRINGTON, April 2.—The President has decided to start on his trip to the Pacific coast on Tuesday, April 14.

The plans for the journey are nearly all completed and the iternary of the tour

ready to give out. This decision of the President is thought to be conclusive evidence that the Italian

affair is not deemed of serious import in

administrative circles. The fact that the Italian Gorernment is now unrepresented in Washington by a full-fledged Minister does not seem to rest heavily, on the minds of either the President or Secretary Blaine. They, of course, take it for granted that in recalling Baron Fava the Italian government intended to at once put an end to the amicable diplomatic relations ex-isting between the two countries, but having left the legation in charge of the first secretary, with orders to transact "current business," they evidently intended to preserve at least a show of respect toward this government.

The President and Secretary of State, it is learned, do not care whether this is the case or not, and after a consultation they decided that, as there was no cause for the recall of Baron Fava, the United States government having done all that It could do when Mr. Blaine wrote to Gov--ernor Nicholis, nothing remains now but to allow the Italian government to send war ships up the mouth of the Mississippl River or take whatever other steps they may deem necessary to emphasize their ill-feeling against the United States government.

To a friend who called upon him the President intimated that, as far as he was concerned, no unusual pains will be taken to appeare the wrath of the Italians.

Little Sympathy Among Italians in England With the Lynched Mon.

LONDON, April 2.—The Italian Vice-Consul in this city in an interview this morning said, that he doubted if there were any members of the Mafia in Lon-

Signor Bonacina, President of the Italian Chamber of Commerce in this city, said in reply to a question, that he considered the action taken by Baron Fava as "somewhat precipitate, and it was a mere flash in the pan which would end in nothing." Continuing, he said:

"There is not much sympathy among Italians in London with the men who were lynched. Italians here opine that there is no doubt that the men charged with the murder of Chief of Police Hennessy were guilty. Still they say that if the lynchers go unpunished, respectable Italians in the United States are not

LITTLE TO FUSS OVER.

Becords of Several of the Italians Lynched In New Orleans.

New Orleans, April 2.—A close examination of the record of the eleven nlieged. assassins discloses the fact that all but four of the eleven slain were registered voters either by birth or naturalization. The four others, whom Cousul Corte claims as entitled to the protection of the Italian Government, are Trabina, Bagnetto, Monsterio and Comitez.

The first named is found to have been a voter in the Parish of St. Charles. Bagnetto is proved to have been a fugitive murderer from Palermo and a member of the Esposito Band of highwaymen. Marchesi was a veteran of Garibaldi's nrmy, but fled from Palerino while charged with murdering a female. Trahina was also a robber in Sicily. Of Comitez no body seems to know anything.

SEVERE ARRAIGNMENT. An Italian Paper's Opinion of the Louis-

lane Officiale. San Francisco, April 2,-"LA-Voce del

Populo," the principal Italian paper in this city, says: "The recall of Baron Fava is an act

worthy of a Government which feels its own dignity and has full consciousness of its own right. It is an act of solemn Indignation of a Government of a people superior by Intelligence, education and honesty against a proceeding in which figures a raked-up gathering of rifflians and slave beaters such as the Governor of Louisiana and the municipality of New Orleans,"

The papers also calls attention to what it considers a serious defect in the United States Constitution and says in spite of the defect the Federal Government must be held responsible.

"The fear of war is absurd," says the paper, "as the matter will be smoothed over.

Italy Will Not Make War.

Paris, April 2.-Signor C. Resemann, Councillor of the Italian Embassy in France, says of the Italy-American entanglement: "If Mr. Blaine has hedged himself in with the plea of non possumus and has refused to satisfy Italy's demand. Baron Fava will receive an unlimited leave of absence, and nothing further will transpire. That is the extreme limit of action to which a European Government can have receourse when it desires United States, italy will not make war."

No Mada Society There.

Haffaron, Pa., April 2.- J. Girimondi, restor of the Italians in this section, has issued a card, in which he denies that a Made Society was recently organized here. He affirms that in the whole of this coal district there are only three italians members of secret organizations and they belong to the Odd Fellows.

CAN'T PUNISH THE LYNCHERS. Judge Marr's Private Opinion on the New

Oricans Trouble.

New Osleans, April 9.-Judge Marr, the presiding magistrate over the section of the Criminal District Court in which the Grand Jury is now serving, to-day expressed the private opinion that nothing. would ever be done to the lynchers who caused the killing of the Italians.

It was impossible to criminally proce cute 5,000 persons, he said, and referred to the famous passage in Burker's oration that there is no law under which a whole country can be indicted. Even if the Grand Jury were to indict the leaders no Jury could ever be secured to try them. Particulars of the Capture of British Officers at Manipur.

Beized While Advancing to Talk - Over Terms of Peace With the Enemy.

A Report That the Tressury of Manipur Has Been Looted-Lack of Ammunition Forced the British Forces to Retreat-The Present Rajah States That He Will Hold Hit Prisoners as Hostages.

CALCUTTA, April 2.-Lieutenant Gurdon, one of the officers who escaped from Manipur, has telegraphed to this city as

"The British force advanced on March 24, in order to arrest Chief Jubrai, who had deposed the Rajah of Manipur: The Manipuris resisted, and a general engage-

"We ran short of ammunition, and retreated to the Residency at Manipur. The Manipuris then attacked and shelled the

"Chief Commissioner Quinton, Political Agent Grimwood and Colonel Skene, who out to meet Chief Jubrai, but the Chief as prisoners.

"After the capture of the British officers the Manipuris resumed their attack on the Residency at two o'clock in the afternoon of March 25. We were obliged to retreat, finding it impossible to defend the Treasury and the Residency owing to want of ammunition. After commencing our retreat, we fought our wax across the hills until we met Cowley's detachment."

A report reaches here that the Treasury of Manipur has been looted. Lieut. Gurdon does not mention how many of the British force escaped or how many were killed. The Manipur Guard is ordinarily made up of about 1,000 men. It is not believed, however, that more than 150 men were mustered within the Treasury enclosure when the natives attacked it. 
